

Use this checklist before and during the cold season to keep your truck safe and reliable.

	SYSTEM	WHAT TO CHECK / DO	WHY IT MATTERS
AVAILABLE TO PURCHASE THROUGH ROAD CHOICE	Battery	 Inspect for wear, corrosion, and charge capacity. Always make sure batteries are charged to no less than 12.4 volts, or 75% state of charge. Replace if older than ~3 years. 	Cold weather reduces battery effectiveness and can prevent starts.
	Coolant & Antifreeze	 Ensure proper coolant level. Use winter-grade fluid that resists freezing and corrosion. Re-check fluid levels periodically through the winter. 	Prevents engine freeze-up and ensures efficient heat transfer.
	Brakes	 Check brake pads, rotors, drums, fluid level, air dryers and cartridges. Replace any worn components with quality Road Choice brake parts. Re-check brakes periodically through the winter. 	Reliable braking is critical on icy, slick roads.
	Hoses & Belts	□ Look for cracks, frays, and/or leaks.□ Replace any compromised parts.	Cold makes these rubber components more brittle.
	Wiper Blades	Upgrade to winter-ready blades.Ensure they clear ice, slush, and snow properly.	Clear visibility is non-negotiable in winter conditions.
	Back of Cab	 Check coiled air cables for cracks to ensure proper function. Inspect coiled electrical cables for corrosion on connectors and replace non-functioning plugs. Ensure 3-in-1 airpower lines have secure fittings, proper suspension, grip condition, and protective spiral wrap integrity. 	Checks ensure proper braking, visibility, and uptime.
	Impact Protection	☐ Install a moose guard.	Adds impact protection to headlights, grille, and engine area.
	Tires & Tire Pressure	 ☐ Install cold-weather or winter tires. ☐ Monitor tread depth and condition. ☐ Check frequently. 	Improves grip and control on snow/ice. Cold air shrinks, lowering pressure. Underinflated tires reduce traction and increase wear.
	Lubrication	 Apply lubricant to hinges, latches, locks, and other exposed moving parts. 	Prevents freezing or seizing of moving parts.
	Fuel Level	☐ Keep tank at least half full (or fuller, when possible).	Helps prevent fuel-line freeze or moisture condensation.
	Emergency Kit	 Stock blankets, flashlight, first-aid kit, nonperishable snacks, etc. Ensure EWT Kit is accessible and functional. Test flashlights periodically through the winter. 	In case of breakdowns or delays, these essentials can save you.
